

Dance Hub Youth Ballet Policies

TUITION*

Single Class per week:

- Single Payment: \$792 due September 2
- OR Three equal payments of \$264
- OR Nine monthly payments of \$88

Two classes per week:

- Single Payment: \$1440 due September 2
- OR Three equal payments of \$480
- OR Nine monthly payments of \$160

***NOTE: Tuition for students starting in Spring semester will be prorated.**

ATTENDANCE

Consistent attendance is mandatory for all DHYB students. Because the curriculum builds throughout the year regular attendance is necessary for students to maintain their progress and keep current with class material.

MAKEUP CLASSES

Should a student need to miss class please contact the studio as soon as possible. Students can make arrangements to make up missed classes with their instructor within 30 days of the missed class.

TARDINESS

All students are expected to be on time for class. We ask that students arrive a few minutes early so that they can be prepared to dance when class starts. Being ready to dance means hair is properly secured and all appropriate dance attire is on.

Tardiness is disruptive to the class and students coming in late miss important exercises for warm up and their overall progress. Regular tardiness is not acceptable. Students having trouble getting to class on time should have their parent or guardian discuss the issue with their instructor. The same rules apply to students regularly leaving class early. We understand emergencies happen. Exceptions are made for special circumstances.

CLASS OBSERVATION

Observation is not allowed inside the studio, except on scheduled observations days. We ask that observation from the lobby is kept to a minimum as it can be distracting to the students and potentially make them nervous or self-conscious.

STUDIO ETIQUETTE

- Students are to store their dance bags and street shoes in the cubbies located in the lobby.
- No food or drink, other than water, is allowed inside the dance studios. Water bottles are permitted and are to be stored in the studio cubbies. Water bottles are never to be placed on top of the piano.
- Only ballet slippers are to be worn in the studios. Street shoes are not allowed. In an effort to keep our dance floors as clean as possible we ask that students only wear their ballet slippers inside the studios and lobby. Please do not wear dance shoes on the pavement outside.
- Students need to have a coverup to wear over their class attire while going to and from the studio such as sweatpants, sweatshirts or even street clothes. This is for their protection and privacy.

PARKING, DROP OFF AND PICK UP

- Students will enter and exit the building through the “back” entrance of the building that faces the Granada Theater. Please do not use the entrance on Victoria Street.
- The studio door will be open at 3:30pm, please do not leave your student unattended any earlier as there may not be any staff in the building prior to 3:30pm.
- Parents/guardians are encouraged to use the Anacapa Parking lot, parking is free for the first 75 minutes. Please do not pull into the alley way to drop off your student.
- If you wish to wait for your student to finish their class you are welcome to wait quietly in our lobby.

DANCE ATTIRE

Fitted dance attire is required in order for the instructor to make sure students are working in proper alignment. Overly baggy clothes make it very difficult to see the student’s placement and form.

GIRLS: Leotards of any solid color (no prints), long or short sleeves, pink tights, pink ballet slippers. Short black wrap ballet skirts are permitted. Fitted wrap ballet sweaters and light-colored leg warmers are ok during colder months.

BOYS: Black or white fitted t-shirt or leotard, black leggings or tights, black ballet slippers with white or black socks. Slim fitted black sweatshirts and black legwarmers are ok during colder months.

HAIR

GIRLS: Long hair should be styled in a neat ballet bun. Ponytails are not acceptable. Short hair should be secured away from the face with a headband or barrettes.

BOYS: Hair should be neat. Longer hair should be away from the face and secured in a ponytail if necessary.
